Location(s): Event sites nationwide, including but not limited to New York, Boston, San

Francisco, Los Angeles, Seattle, Chicago, Minneapolis, Washington DC,

Los Angeles, Atlanta, Dallas, Miami, New Jersey and Orlando.

Time Requirements: 5 hours/event (3 hours at event + 2 hours post-event photo editing)

About the Foundation

Located in New York City, the Lymphoma Research Foundation is the nation's largest non-profit organization devoted to funding innovative research and serving the lymphoma community through a comprehensive series of education programs, outreach initiatives, and patient services. The Foundation is dedicated to finding a cure for lymphoma, the most common form of blood cancer, by funding biomedical research and supporting the next generation of lymphoma researchers. With the guidance of a prestigious Scientific Advisory Board (SAB), which is comprised of 45 of the world's leading lymphoma experts, the Foundation invests in the research and scientists which have the greatest potential to improve our understanding of lymphomas and lead to improved treatment options for patients. To date, the Foundation has funded more than \$80 million in research focused on the origins and treatment of lymphoma.

Through comprehensive disease guides and publications, in-person conferences, and online resources, the Foundation provides education for people with lymphoma, as well as their loved ones and caregivers. A robust suite of patient services provides direct support to people who have received a lymphoma diagnosis. These services include the national Lymphoma Helpline, a Clinical Trials Information Service, Lymphoma Support Network, and patient aid grant program. An industry leader in digital communications, the Foundation maintains a strong presence on multiple social media platforms and has won national awards for its innovative use of social media to educate cancer patients. The Foundation developed a first of its kind mobile app for people with lymphoma which was recognized by Apple as one of the best medical apps in the country. The Foundation also provides continuing medical education programs designed to increase the knowledge, skills and performance of healthcare professionals who treat and care for people with lymphoma.

About the Opportunity

The Foundation seeks professional or skilled amateur photographers/videographers to provide photography services at events around the country. Specific needs will vary depending on event, but may include candid event shots, as well as posed group photos. Video editing opportunities also are available.

Depending on your location, examples of opportunities include:

Lymphoma Walks (New York, Chicago, Minneapolis): Photograph event morning festivities (usually outdoors in a park), take walk team photos, document short opening program and speakers. Work in tandem with onsite Foundation staff.

Fundraise Your Way Initiatives (*Nationwide*): Photograph community-based events, document the fun and creative ways individuals find to support the Foundation (ranging from community walks to local concerts and beyond).

Education Events (Los Angeles, Seattle, Boston, Chicago, San Francisco): Photograph a lymphoma education event, usually at a hotel conference center. Attendees may include patients, care partners or health care professionals.

Goal

Document Foundation events and provide photographs or videos to the Lymphoma Research Foundation (all images will become property of the Foundation and may be used on Foundation website, event promotions, social media).

Benefits

Utilize your professional talents to partner with the Lymphoma Research to achieve our mission – to realize the promise of science to eradicate lymphoma and serve the community touched by this disease.

Qualifications

At least 21 years old Professional or skilled amateur photographer/videographer Provide your own equipment Able to provide own transportation to event

Training

Upon reviewing credentials and receiving a specific assignment, volunteers will be contacted by Foundation staff and will receive all details needed to complete their project.

Need to Know

- Volunteers will be matched with an event near their location.
- Volunteers will be required to sign a liability waiver, as well as an intellectual property waiver. All

photos, video and content must be given to the Foundation and volunteers may not keep or sell content in the future.

- Volunteers are responsible for all expenses, including travel, related to their volunteer role.
- All photos become intellectual property of the Foundation.
- Photographs or video must be provided to the Foundation within one week following the event.
- If a current opportunity does not exist, volunteer details will be kept on file and contacted if a future need arises.
